The list is purposefully short. We included a range of grapes, regions and countries to please a variety of palates. Should you want to discuss more expensive wines or a favourite wine not on our list, just ask.

Champagne and Sparkling Wine

Taltarni "T" Series NV Sparkling **£22**

Taltarni, based in Victoria, Australia, makes sparkling wines with traditional French methods. The three classic champagne grapes used to make the "T" combine to create a crisp, balanced taste that is an ideal fizz for celebrations.

Taltarni Taché 2007 Rosé **£27**

Another traditionally-made sparkling wine from Australia made by Taltarni. Special enough to be vintage ... and who can resist that lovely pink colour?

De Castellane Brut Croix Rouge NV Champagne **£39**

Our supplier says that the champagnes made by de Castellane are "sexy, seductive and daring". We like the Brut for its bubbles, smooth taste and because it is made by the people at Laurent-Perrier who know a thing or two about champagne.

De Castellane Brut Rosé NV Champagne **£46**

The delicate salmon pink colour of this champagne is indeed seductive. There's just something about rosé champagne that makes a wedding exceptionally pretty. Round and fresh, this is a great rosé for the price.

Pol Roger Brut Reserve NV Champagne **£53**

From one of the great houses, an elegant, soft champagne with deep fruit. The favourite of Sir Winston Churchill who reputedly said of this wine, "In victory, deserve it. In defeat, need it."

Veuve Clicquot Yellow Label NV Champagne **£53**

It is always a good idea to invite the Widow to a celebration! Creamy and zesty with pleasing depth, it is no wonder that this is a favourite.

Perrier Jouët Grand Brut NV **£53**

White

False Bay Chenin Blanc 2008

£17

The rugged terrain of the Western Cape of South Africa and the traditional wine-making principles of the team at False Bay Vineyards combine to make this smooth Chenin Blanc a perfect white wine for a variety of dishes. This wine was recently given a Gold List medal at the 2009 UK Sommelier awards for house wine and wine by the glass.

Peter Lehmann Chardonnay, Weighbridge, 2008

£17

A fresh-tasting Chardonnay made by innovative winemakers in the Barossa Valley of South Australia. Unwooded, with none of that overly oaked flavour formerly associated with Chardonnay, this wine is clean and balanced.

Vertiere, Pinot Grigio delle Venezie IGT, 2008

£20

A full-bodied Pinot Grigio from the Veneto in Italy. This wine is not as acidic as many Pinot Grigios and has a delicate, fruity taste. It is an elegant partner to a delicious meal.

Lawsons Dry Hills, Moa Ridge Sauvignon Blanc

£23

The moa, now extinct, was one of New Zealand's flightless birds. By contrast, this wine flies very smoothly on the palate and represents some of the increasingly interesting wines to come from the moa's native land.

Rosé

Rosato Veronese IGT, Veritiere, 2007

£17

A summer day lazing in the sunshine distilled into a glass. This lovely, crisp yet full-bodied rosé is made in the Veneto in Italy.

Red

Costa Vera, Merlot, Mapio Valley 2007

£17

Chilean wines such as this represent fantastic quality for the price. The deep ruby colour of this Merlot reflects its juicy, rounded taste. This wine is perfect for meat dishes or a cheese course.

Soleus, Organic Cabernet Sauvignon

£17

We like this one because it tastes great. The fact that it is organic is an added bonus. The Cabernet Sauvignon grape makes a wine that is an ideal partner to meat dishes.

J. Lohr, Wildflower

£23

There has to be a few American wines on our list! This wine, made from Valdiguié grapes, grows in the wind-swept region of Monterey, south of San Francisco where the people at J. Lohr do everything from tend the grapes to bottle the wine.

Loredona Pinot Noir 2007

£24

A new world Pinot Noir made in Monterey County, California. Its complexity is enhanced by barrel aging for nine months in a mixture of new and used French and American oak.

After dinner...

Krohn Rio Torto Reserva Port

£5 per glass

Deep red colour; opulent, rich plummy fruit with real depth of flavour, expressing pure, youthful and high quality fruit.

Krohn Heritage Fine Tawny Port

£5 per glass

Fine and complex nose with rich, spicy dried fruit and nut flavours.
